Initial MEET AND GREET This Friday, **September 27th**, from **8:30-9:30 AM**, for your child to meet their coach/teammates and hand out jerseys and hats. In addition, we will have some fun stations set up where the kids can practice hitting, throwing, and running the bases.

We are tentatively planning to start the season on **October 4th**, but we know this falls at the beginning of the October break for ASD. To ensure we have enough players around, we kindly ask that you complete this <u>Google</u> form to let me know if your child will be able to attend practices on **October 4th** and/or **October 11th**. Once I receive this information I will send an email to confirm practice on those dates.

Each practice will have three stations: one for hitting, another for running the bases/fielding, and a third for a fun game. After rotating each team rotates through the stations, the teams will play a short game, with each team playing each other for an inning. **Parents!!! Please consider helping with your child during the actual practice.**

- Attend an In-person training on October 17th 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. with Coach Sarafin
- □ Attend a second in person training on October 24th from 6:30-8:30 pm with Coach Reid
- Pass a Written Test based off of the <u>Umpire training videos</u> before November 1st. (Tentatively Tuesday, Oct. 29th 7:30pm)

WE have a STUDENT umpire training program where players 12 and up can umpire for service, or pay AFTER passing the training requirements.



Communication by Division

- Each Team will have a specific communication system. (Typically Whatsapp, email, etc.)
- As teams are decided, your coaches will be reaching out to you.
- This is a great opportunity to share your talents by being a Team mom/dad. Arranging snacks, scorekeeping, dug out help, or more.

If your player is not going to be at practice, or a game PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE inform your coach ahead of time. (Line ups depend on it)

- How parents address concerns
 - Coach first
 - If not resolved discuss with the Division Coordinator
 - If not resolved, involve the Player agent and Coaching Coordinator
 - If not resolved, inform Vice President and President.



Equipment

WHAT EQUIPMENT DOES QLL PROVIDE FOR THE LEAGUE?

- QLL will have league owned C-Flap helmets available for players to use
- · QLL will have bats available for players to use
- QLL will have catcher's gear for the catchers to use
- QLL also provides a uniform jersey and baseball cap
- If you use it, please put it back in the same place
- No one goes home until all gear is returned and locked up

WHAT DO THE PLAYERS NEED TO PROVIDE?

- Glove
- Athletic footwear (cleats are suggested, but not required; no metal cleats)
- Athletic attire (We encourage baseball or softball pants and belt, but they are not required)
- An athletic cup for 12U and up (can be purchased at Decathelon (Boxing section))
- You can purchase your own helmets, bats, batting gloves, and more, but they must meet our safety requirement and bat standards per division.
- Baseball/Softball Equipment is not available in Qatar but can be ordered online
 - Or check with us to see what we still have in our used equipment sale

Catchers

- Must wear catchers helmet w/ face mask & throat guard, chest protector & shin guards
- Male catchers must wear a long-model chest protector, protective supporter and cup at all times
- QLL will ensure team equipment has been inspected by a QLL official and that it is functioning properly
- Parents are encouraged to inspect personal equipment prior to each game



A Gentle Reminder

- Please Remember, We are guests of ASD. The designated areas we are allowed to be in are:
 - The baseball field, bleachers, or other practice area with a coach
 - Sitting inside the building to cool off, or work is fine, but classrooms are off limits
 - Children are not allowed in the Middle School playground area-even with an adult
- QLL Gear Usage and Storage
 - All QLL equipment should be treated with care and respect
 - Everything that is borrowed is returned at the end of each practice/game
 - No one goes home until everything is locked up
- You must have an identification to get onto campus



QLL Safety Plan

- QLL officers, coaches, parents & players will take safety issues seriously
- In 1995, Little League Baseball introduced A Safety Awareness Program (ASAP) with the goal of:
 - Re-emphasizing the position of a Safety Officer to "create awareness, through education and information, of the opportunities to provide a safer environment for kids and all participants of Little League Baseball"
- The <u>QLL Safety Plan is qualified by the ASAP program</u>
- The Qatar Little League program has an active Safety Officer on file with Little League Headquarters
 - Safety Officer is Steven Riddle for the 2024-2025 season



Adverse Weather Conditions

• Air Quality Index (AQI)

- US EPA's AQI is a uniform, color-coded index for reporting and forecasting daily air quality
- AQI of 151 to 200 = practice and games will be cancelled
- AQI of 201 to 300 = practice and games will be cancelled or stopped
- QLL reserves the right to cancel any practice or game with lower AQI thresholds in the interest of play, family or spectator safety as the discretion of the QLL Board
- Shamal winds, which are associated with the strengthening of a highpressure area over the peninsula after the passage of a cold front.
 - Winds exceeding 15 mph/24 kpm/13kn = practice and games MAY be cancelled or stopped
 - Winds exceeding 25 mph/40 kpm/22kn = practice and games MUST be cancelled or stopped
- Weather conditions will be monitored using <u>+IQAir</u>
 - Or through Qatar's <u>Civil Aviation Authority's Meteorology site</u>
- QLL Lightning Policy can be found in Appendix D of the Safety Plan atthe Leag

Safety First

- Practices and/or games may be called at the discretion of the QLL board in the event of any adverse weather or air quality condition. Additionally, Coaches and/or Division Coordinators can exercise stop play authority at any time for any adverse weather or air quality concern deemed as a hazard at the time
- The Board does its best to make determinations of when to call a game, or a practice as soon as we possibly can, but we also recognize the changing weather patterns can happen very quickly, so please be patient with us
- Families ALWAYS have the individual choice to decide if they want to keep their player home due to a potential concern about heat, wind, AQI, or more. What we ask is you inform the coaches
- Remember, if there is any doubt, stand-down practices or games.
 - Nothing comes before the safety of our players, families and spectators
 - Coaches and Division Coordinators should always check conditions beforehand



Safety Training for Volunteers

- All Coaches attend a pre-season orientation meeting and are trained in
 - Concussion Training: CDC.GOV/HEADSUP/
 - Basic First Aid
 - Child safeguarding
- All umpires are expected to participate in a pre-season rules and umpire clinic at the direction of QLL officials.
- First Aid Supply is kept in QLL storage near field
- We are always looking for a medically licensed QLL community member to do deepen our training on first aid
- In case of emergency Dial 999



Parent Code of Conduct

- As a Qatar Little League player's Parent/Guardian, I hereby pledge that I will:
 - To the best of my ability, ensure my player arrives to practice on time ready to play ball
 - Encourage good sportsmanship and demonstrate positive support at all times
 - Remember that players participate to have fun and the game is for youth
 - Teach my child that doing one's best is more important than winning
 - Refrain from coaching my child during games and practices
 - Respect the officials and their authority during games
 - Not confront coaches at any time during games
 - Not engage in any kind of unsportsmanlike conduct with any official, coach, player, or parent
- Please Note:
 - Coaches are volunteers and parents
 - Umpires are volunteers and most often students
 - Please communicate with your coach if your player will not be present or will be late



Player Code of Conduct

- As a Qatar Little League participant, I hereby pledge that I will:
 - Respect the game of baseball/softball by playing by the rules/policies of the game
 - Respect property and equipment belonging to QLL, ASD, and others
 - Show respect to my fellow team members and coaches by playing hard and giving maximum effort
 - Be a team player, support my teammates, and display good sportsmanship at all times
 - Refrain from using violence, unfriendly language, or insults to others
 - Refrain from challenging or questioning on-field calls by officials or coaches
 - Be generous when I win and gracious when I lose
 - Conduct myself with honor and dignity
 - Not leave the field until all QLL gear is properly put away



Coach Code of Conduct

- As a Qatar Little League Coach, I hereby pledge that I will:
 - Do my best to provide a safe playing environment for all players
 - Lead by example in demonstrating fair play and sportsmanship, and treating all coaches, officials, parents, and players with respect
 - Remember my responsibility to the QLL mission to foster a developmental league and serve as a developmental coach for youth
 - Place the emotional and physical well-being of players ahead of a desire to win
 - Respect the game of baseball/softball by coaching by the rules and adhering to policies
 - Treat each player as an individual and remember the broad range of emotional and physical development across our league divisions
 - Teach the rules of the game to all players, officials, and parents
 - Not abuse other coaches, umpires, parents, or players
 - Not engage in the use of profanity or any other offensive language
 - Not leave the sports area until all players have been picked up
 - Not leave the field until all QLL gear is properly put away

Travel Ball Policy

- There must be a parent (of a child in the age division) willing to coach a specific team
- Team Selection Process
 - Parent/Player indicates interest
 - Coaches select players to make a team based on
 - Previous or current QLL season performance, attitude, effort, coachability, assessment scores

Tournament Roster

- Roster selected per tournament based on player
 - Availability, performance, attendance, attitude, effort
- Communication will be asap and no less than one month in advance where possible
- Each player guaranteed at least one inning per tournament game
- Adding/Removing players to Team
 - Can be added based on coach observed season performance, individual assessments
 - Can be removed based on attitude, performance, behavior, attendance



Travel Ball Commitments

- Travel ball is funded MOSTLY by players/families.
- QLL covers the cost of one tournament registration fee
- Uniform:
 - QLL regular season hat
 - Belt and socks ordered in bulk (for color match)
 - White pants ordered individually
 - Usual baseball gear
- Travel Expenses:
 - Airline tickets
 - Hotel accommodations
 - Team bus shared cost
 - Tournament registration (if not first)
 - Other misc travel expenses

Payers must be accompanied by a parent or guardian on all tournament travel
